Dr. Graesser is presently a full professor in the Department of Psychology and an adjunct professor in Computer Science at The University of Memphis. He is currently a co-director of the Institute for Intelligent Systems, chair of the Department of Psychology, and director of the Center for Applied Psychological Research. In 1977 Dr. Graesser received his Ph.D. in psychology from the University of California at San Diego. He was a visiting researcher at Yale University in 1983, Stanford University in 1984, and Carnegie Mellon University in 1991. Dr. Graesser's primary research interests are in cognitive science and discourse processing. More specific interests include knowledge representation, question asking and answering, tutoring, text comprehension, inference generation, conversation, reading, education, memory, expert systems, artificial intelligence, and human-computer interaction. He is currently editor of the journal *Discourse Processes*. In addition to publishing nearly 300 articles in journals, books, and conference proceedings, he has written 2 books and has edited 8 books (the most recent one being the *Handbook of Discourse Processes*). He has designed, developed, and tested cutting edge software in learning, language, and discourse technologies, including AutoTutor, Coh-Metrix, HURA Advisor, Question Understanding Aid (QUAID), QUEST, and Point&Query.

A decade of sex research: Links to drug addiction

I received my Ph.D. in Experimental Psychology in 1994 from the University of Texas, under the supervision of Michael Domjan. My dissertation research was on the conditioned anticipatory responses of male Japanese quail during sexual behavior. From 1994-1996, I continued this line of research as a postdoctoral fellow here at the University of Kentucky. I was hired as faculty after completion of my postdoctoral position, and am currently an Associate Professor.

The overall goal of my research has been to contribute to the understanding of learning mechanisms involved in motivated behaviors, in particular sexual behavior and drug-taking behavior. Both of these behaviors are heavily influenced by specific stimuli in the environment. Therefore, the main focus of my behavioral research has been on how various cues come to control and modify these highly motivated behaviors. In addition, because in humans, there appears to be some relationship between drug taking behavior and risky sexual behavior, we're interested in the causal relationship between these two motivated behaviors.

Students in my laboratory have an opportunity to conduct behavioral experiments using classical and operant conditioning procedures to study sexual and mating behavior, drug reward, and social learning. Because we're interested in the underlying neurochemical and brain mechanisms of behavior, students also have the opportunity for training in pharmacological and surgical techniques.

The primary focus of my research has to do with the development of psychopathology and children and adolescents, from the perspective of their socialization in family, peer and school environments. This research has a dual focus, longitudinal research on the risk factors associated with the development of conduct problems and aggression, and description of the learning, affects and information processing mechanisms by which families, peers and teachers influence development, particularly in the context of socioeconomic disadvantage. This research, of course, should inform preventive and clinical intervention. A number of students are currently developing and implementing an intervention for newly divorced custodial parents whose children are experiencing difficulty with this high risk transition. We are also involved in contributing to and evaluating a 5-year Early Head Start Program which not only promotes child development (0-3), but also provides educational and other services needed to increase the self sufficiency and cohesion of high risk families.

Genetic approaches to studies of social behavior

Mammalian social behavior is complex, yet a systematic genetic approach can reveal the major genes that regulate behavior. Because many social behaviors are activated only when gonadal steroid hormones are present the genes for steroid hormone receptors are currently under study in our laboratory. We have found that estrogen receptor (ER) is required for display of male typical social behavior. In addition the newly discovered estrogen receptor, ER β , is particularly important for regulation of cognitive behaviors and has much of its effects via modulation of ER α 's actions. One of our long term goals is to better elucidate the relationship between these two important receptors and to identify downstream neurotransmitters that are involved in social behavior. To this end we have recently expanded our program to ask how dopamine receptor genes affect social behaviors. A final important set of genes that are present in male, but not in female mammals are the genes on the Y sex chromosome. Although these genes are essential for development of sperm cells they are also expressed in brain and their behavioral functions are being elucidated in our laboratory.

Dr. Elena L. Grigorenko received her Ph.D. in general psychology from Moscow State University, Russia in 1990 and Ph.D. in developmental psychology and genetics from Yale University, U.S.A. in 1996. Currently, Dr. Grigorenko is Associate Professor of Child Studies and Psychology at Yale and Associate Professor of Psychology at Moscow State University. Dr. Grigorenko has published more than 150 peer reviewed articles, book chapters, and books. She has received awards for her work from five different divisions of the American Psychological Association: the Gardner Lindzey Dissertation Award in General Psychology, Sigmund Koch Early Career Award in Theoretical and Philosophical Psychology, Berlyne Early Career Award for Creative Achievement in Psychology of the Arts, Boyd McCandless Early Career Award in Developmental Psychology, and Richard E. Edward P. Kardas is professor of psychology at Southern Arkansas University where he has served nearly 25 years. In 2002, he was named as SAU's Honor Professor, their highest award. Previous academic appointments were at LSU-Eunice and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. He holds a PhD in comparative-developmental psychology from Louisiana State University. He received his BS from the University of Baltimore and previously attended the Johns Hopkins University. His chief scholarly interests are teaching, textbook writing, and the intelligent use of technology. Because his father was in the Foreign Service, his childhood was spent largely in Latin America where he was an eyewitness to three revolutions (Columbia, Argentina, and Cuba). His computer was the first one on campus to be connected to the Internet. Since then, technological solutions to teaching problems have become a major preoccupation. In 1996, he and Tommy Milford authored one of the first texts on using the Internet in teaching, *Using the Internet for social science research and practice*. Later he wrote *Psychology resources on the World Wide Web*. Currently, he and Chris Spatz are finishing a text in research methods in psychology. Kardas' current research centers on how to encourage people to form and use on-line communities. SWPA's Web page is the nexus of one of those communities. Mellow since recovering from brain surgery in 1996, he swims and has recently discovered golf. He is married to the former Julie McCuller and they have three children.
